### REPORT OF COMMITTEE PRESENTED

Hon. Thérèse Lavoie-Roux: Honourable senators, I have the honour to present the following report concerning the Senate Estimates for the fiscal year 1994-95.

Wednesday, January 19, 1994

The Standing Committee on Internal Economy, Budgets and Administration has the honour to present the following report:

Your committee has examined and approved the Senate Estimates for the fiscal year 1994-95 and recommends their adoption.

The total Senate Estimates for 1994-95 will be \$42,014,000. This is the third year during which the Senate budget shows a reduction. In the previous two years, the budget was reduced by 2.5% and 1.9% respectively. In 1994-95, the proposed draft budget is reduced by another 1.4% from the previous year although the workload is assessed to be higher than in 1993-94 as it will be the first year after an election.

A summary of the Expenditure Budget 1994-95 accompanies this report.
