

Trustees, or the Secretary of the Congregation, and placed before the Trustees in the order received at their first regular meeting.

XI.

No person will be permitted to make any alteration in his pew or sittings except such as the Trustees may assent to. No cushion to be stuffed with wool or any material that will harbour moths, and all are to be covered with material of the same color as the lining of the pews.

XII.

When a pewowner with his family removes from the City of Halifax, and is absent for one year and ceases to contribute to the funds of the Church, his right to the pew shall revert to the Congregation and the Trustees may allot the same to any applicant.

XIII.

The Trustees shall appoint a sexton whose duty it shall be to open and shut the doors of the Church, to see that it is kept clean and in good order; to deliver notices and to attend to such other duties connected with the Church as may be necessary under the direction of the Trustees and Kirk Session.

XIV.

All sums collected in the Church for charitable purposes, for the Church library, for Sabbath School support, for the purchase of Sacramental elements or any other purpose connected with the spiritual edifi-
