

3. CLASSIFICATION OF PROPOSALS THAT HAVE BEEN ADVANCED TO SECURE THIS APPROXIMATION OF ECONOMIC AND ACTUAL WAGES, OR TO EFFECT ALTERATION IN THE EXISTING SYSTEM OF THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE PRODUCT.

- (j) Collectivism (Marx).
- (k) Communism (Fourier).
- (l) Anarchist-Socialism (Kropotkin).
