

Part having its proper Governor, who was also Proprietor of his own Division. The first of these Districts comprehended all the Land on the South Side of the River of *St. Lawrence*, from *New England* to *Port Royal*. That Part of the *Peninsula* which lies between *Port Royal* and *Cape Canço*, was contained in the second, the Governor of which resided at *La Heve*; and the third extended from *Canço* to *Cape Gaspe*, at the Mouth of the above-mentioned River.

These Governors likewise provided each for securing his own Demesne, by building Forts in proper Places. In the first Division one was built at *Pentagoet*, another at *St. John's River*, and a third at *Port Royal*: The second had Fort *La Tour*, already built, to which was added another at *La Heve*: The third satisfied himself with a good Entrenchment at *Chedabouctou*, thinking it unnecessary to be at any Expence on the rest of the Eastern Coast, which bounding to the Gulf of *St. Lawrence*, he judg'd was sufficiently secured by the Isle of *Cape Breton*, and the *French* Settlements at the Mouth of the *Canada* River, especially as it was not likely the *English* would make any Attempts on that Side.

In adjusting these Boundaries of the whole Province, it is very observable, that as this
