IX. So much of the third section of the Judicature Act of Number of 1849, chapter 38, as limits the number of Judges of the Superior Judges of Su-Court to ten, or as appoints the places at which they shall increased. reside, is hereby repealed; and the said Superior Court shall consist of eighteen Judges, that is to say, of a Chief Justice and seventeen Puisné Judges; and such Judges, including the Chief Justice, shall ordinarily exercise their judicial functions in the District or Districts or Counties, which shall from time to time be prescribed and assigned to them by the Governor.

X.
