MATTHEWS WIN THE CENTRAL LEAGUE

Defeat Strollers in Roll-Off for the O'Connor Cup—The Averages

Matthews (Ld.), winners of the first series, and Strollers, winners of the second series, rolled off last night for first money and the O'Connor Cup at the Brunswick Bowling Club.
