Tyrone May Go to Ulster, The general impression prevails that the conference will settle this matter, since nobody believes that the question of the exclusion of one county will be allowed by eight politicians possessing the ability of the conferees to turn the scales for civil war.
At the same time it is not thought

that parliament will accept any com-promise going beyond the offers al-ready made and refused, and if the house of commons did do so, Ireland would not fall into line.

King Welcomes Conferees.
King George, in receiving the conferees at Buckingham Palace, made the following brief speech:
"It is with feelings of satisfaction and hopefulness that I receive you here today, and I thank you for the manner in which you have responded to my summons. It is also a matter for congraculation that the speaker of the house of commons has consented to preside over your meeting. My intervention at this moment may be regarded as a new departure." "Not the new departure, but the exceptional circumstances under which you are brought together, justify my

"For months we have watched with deep misgivings the course of events in Ireland. The trend has been surely and steadily toward an appeal to force, and today the croy of civil war is on minded of my people.

"We have in the past endeavored to act as a civilizing example to the world, and to me it is unthinkable, as It must be to you, that we should be brought to the brink of fratricidal strife upon issues apparently so capable of adjustment as those you are now asked to consider, if handled in a spirit of generous compromise.
"My apprehension in contemplation of such a dire calamity is intensified my feeling of attachment to Ireland and of sympathy with her people who have always welcomed me with warm-hearted affection.

Responsibility Great. "Gentlemen, you represent in one form or another the vast number of my subjects at home. You also have a deep interest in my dominions oversea, which are scarcely less concerned in the prompt and friendly settlement of this question.

"I regard you, then, in this matter trustees for the honor and peace "Your responsibilities are, indeed,

great. The time is short. You will, I know, employ it to the fullest ad-vantage and he patient, earnest and conciliatory.
