MONTREAL, Oct. 12.-A broad an

New System of Quotations for New York Exchange in Effect Today.

CHANGE IN FIGURES

Apparent Halving in Values Brought About by New System.

NEW YORK, Oct. 12.—When the stock exchange opens tomorrow certain favorite stocks will apparently be halved in value altho in reality there will be no change in their worth. Thus Reading, Pennsylvania and Westinghouse, selling Monday at 161, 117 and 138, will be listed at 80%, 55½ and 69 respectively unless there be the usual variation in quotations over a holiday. The reason for this is found in an announcement made at the stock ex-

The reason for this is found in an announcement made at the stock exchange today, asserting that certain amendments to the constitution had been approved, almost unanimously by the members. One of these amendments provided for quoting all stocks in terms of dollars instead of points, as heretofore. Reading, Pennsylvania and Westinghouse, together with a number of other issues, are of \$50 par value, but have been quoted on a hundred point basis in the past. In future they will be quoted in terms of dollars, which apparently halves their values.
