

INFORMATION FOR STRANGERS

This guide to the city and its environs is presented by the Tourist Association of Victoria in the hope that it will aid the visitor in "making his way about," and seeing some of the many places and things that are worth seeing.

Very often a person arriving in a new city is at a loss regarding the points of the compass, so it may be explained that the general layout of the shore line of Victoria Harbor is north and south. Government and parallel streets run north and south; Yates, Fort, Johnson, etc., run east and west. The Parliament Buildings stand at the south end of the harbor, facing north.

CAR SERVICE

The central point at which to take street cars is the junction of Government and Yates streets.

Cars for Victoria West and Esquimalt leave there every 15 minutes from 6 a.m. until 11:30 p.m. week days, and from 9 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. Sundays.
