MOTION by Mr. VYNER,

*Martis 26<sup>o</sup> die Maii, 1778.*

“on convention at Saratoga, in America;  
“and also by what means Lieutenant Gene-  
“ral Burgoyne, who commanded that army,  
“and was included in that convention, was  
“released, and is now returned to England?”

Mr. Vyner, in opening the motion, stated  
some questions to General Burgoyne, which  
he proposed to ask in the committee.

who also stated further questions in respect to
