HAMILTON, Nov. 29.—(Special.)—At the meeting of the board of health this evening, William Farrar suggested that a member of it should have a seat on the board of control. Steamer Declared Lost. PALERMO, Italy, Nov. 29.—Hope for the missing freight steamer Manhattan, which has not been heard of since she left New York on Sept. 23, was given up to-day. The Manhattan was loaded with oil and bound for Algiers. She flew a German flag and was owned by the Italian-American Oil Company. She was built in Glasgow in 1888 and carried a crew of 25 men.
