CANADIAN SWIMMERS FOR FESTIVAL OF EMPIRE.

MONTREAL, April 30.—The first step towards a Dominion-wide organization of swimming clubs was taken at the annual meeting of the Canadian Amateur Swimming Association Saturday, when the secretary was authorized to communicate with representative organizations in the provinces with a view to the formation of a subordinate provincial branches. Clubs in British Columbia, Manitoba, Alberta and Nova Scotia had already invited such action. The fixing of dates for the championships was not settled, but the event will be divided between Halifax and Ottawa.

The officers elected were: President, A. M. Hannah, Montreal; vice-president, D. Crutchlow, Montreal; P. O. South, Halifax; Charles Norris, Toronto; W. Rowan, silver medal.

Jimmy Lane is Second and Usage Third—Opening at Lexington.

BALTIMORE, April 29.—Beautiful racing weather brought out about six thousand people to witness the opening of the spring meeting of the Maryland Jockey Club at Pimlico this afternoon. Almost every one well known in racing circles is here, as this is the only real big race meet of the year in the east. Three part-mutuel machines were put in operation for the first time on the local track and were liberally patronized. The feature of an excellent card was the inaugural Steeplechase at two miles.
