



Invertige to one thousand pupple of the proper training in shorthand, typewriting, etc. data for a proper training in shorthand, typewriting, etc. data for the daily papers, catalogs, etc., elain to be the "leaders." Before enrolling intending pupils should make careful enquiry as to the typewriter equipment used. Some schools are equipped with old and out-of-date machines, with a view to lessening the expense, which is invariably at the student's cost.
Many students on entering their first position, find to their sorrow that they have received tuition on machines that are entirely obsolete.
A carefully prepared census shows that in Canada there are over seven thousand typewriters in use; of this number nearly six thousand are Underwoods. 
