SOCIALISTS IN BUDAPEST PROVOKE A BLOODY RIOT

Porce Postponement of Parade and Lead Attack on Independence Club-Half a Hundred Victims of Fray-Revolutionary Sentiment is Gaining Ground.

Buda-Pesth. Sept. 27.-Between 40 and 50 persons were injured in riots here to-night when Socialists and adherents of the coalition parties, including students, clashed opposite the Royal Hotel and for two hours there were scenes of wild tremendous exitement. The Royal

were scenes of wild tremendous excitement. The Royal Hotel is the headquarters of the Independence Club, in which is the council-room of the coalition leaders.

The students and other supporters of the coalition had arranged for a gigantic torchlight procession to-night, but during the day Socialists issued inflammatory proclamations calling on all Socialists and others opposed to the coalition to gather and fight for their rights, which they said the coalition was trying to sidetrack under cover of an alleged affront by the king-emperor to the whole nation. Owing to these proclamations the coalition leaders decided to postpone the torchlight procession, seeking thus the torchlight procession, seeking thus

to avoid bloodshed.

At 8 o'clock about 1500 Socialists At 8 o'clock about 1500 Socialists gathered outside the Independence Club and announced their intention of entering and tearning down the council-room. A large force of police was present and were assisted by 150 leading citizens. The mob made an effort enter, but was vigorously opposed the police.

A fight ensued and amid the wildest clamor severol persons were stabbed; but the Socialists were finally scattered. Fifteen minutes later, however the Socialists again gathered. By this time many adherents of the coalition appeared and a free fight ensued. QUEBEC AND NEWFOUNDLAND IN CLASH OVER TERRITORY

rovince Orders Seizure of Logs Cut on Labrador Coast Under Authority of Island Government.

Montreal, Sept. 27 .- (Special.) - The dispute arising out of Newfoundland's claims to terrotorial rights on Hamilton Inlet, on the coast of Labrador, came to a sensational climax to-day, when the Quebec government ordered the seizure of the logs cut under authority of the Newfoundland govern-

The lands in dispute concern that part of Ungava governed by the Do-minion, the Province of Quebec and Newfoundland. Labrador is owned by Newfoundland, but the government of the island has extended its sovereignty to include the territory bordering on the tidal waters of Hamilton Inlet. Acting on this claim it granted important timber concessions to a company. Protests were at once issued by the Dominion on behalf of Ungava, which lies to the north of Hamilton Inlet, and by the Province of Quebec, which lies to the south.
