The James Clark Made a Total Wreck at NEIL M'NEILL KILLED. Michael's Bay on Saturday.

Prominent Farmer Near Walkerton L His Life While Harvesting.

Walkerton, Ont., Aug. 18.-Mr. Neil M. wells, aged 60, a prominent farmer living on the south line of Brant, about two miles from Walkerton, was killed this evening by his team running away with the binder. He fell under the binder and was injured so badly that he died in a few minutes himself, was burned to the water's edge near Michael's Bay on Saturday morning. Capt. Darling, when interviewed by the representative of the Associated Press, stated the tug left Collingwood Thursday with a scow in tow, and was lying to when the fire was discovered by Capt. Craig. The fire was first noticed at 3 o'clock around the boiler, from which it is supposed to have originated. Every ef-fort was made to extinguish the fiames, but all proved fuile. The boat was beach-ed on a reef in Michael's Bay, two miles from shore. She will be a total loss. She was valued at \$5000, and was partially in-

Oswego, N.Y., Aug. 18.—Three huge fun-nel-shaped waterspouts formed in Lake Ontario, about two miles out off this port at 7 o'clock this morning, and as they moved down the lake they attracted a great deal of attention. Shortly after they burst and disappeared, and with their disappear-ance came a heavy rain, and in places back from the lake a heavy hallstorm. The latter did some damage to tobacco.




