PALMER PROPERTY SOLD FOR Y.M.C.A. BUILDING

Quarter of a Million Dollar Building Will Be On College, Near Yonge.

The new Y. M. C. A. home will be on-College-street, near Yonge, the building committee having bought the property No. 40, owned and occupied by Dr. L. Lorne Palmer, and the vacant lot east owned by Alexander Keith. For the Palmer property the price paid was \$215 a foot, or \$33,000 in all, while a like price per foot was paid for the Keith lot. This will give a frontage of 205 1-2

and a depth of 105 feet.

The building to be erected by the association will cost in the neighborhood of a quarter of a million dollars, and the plans include the erection of 250 dormitories, and a dining hall, for residents. Whether this program will be interfered with by the university authorities, who reserve the right to what class of buildings shall be erected on the street, is a matter for consideration, but it is not thoughthat on account of the character of the institution the university will inter-The university owns College st. from Yonge to St. George, and has leased it to the city for 99 years, reserving the right to compel property ownon either side to pay for entrance In default of payment the university may erect a board fence in front of any property. To ensure the right of entrance to the street the university claims \$15 a foot, which was the figure fixed by the courts in the case of the Conservatory of Music property. The conservatory bought its present site from the Wilson Estate, but would not take it over until it had established a clear right to entrance to the to asses sthe price. Dr. Palmer, who has now sold to the Y. M. C. A., paid for the right of entrance, which carried with it the reservation that no building designed for a store or boarding house shall be crected on the property. An act of parliament also gives the university the power to stipulate the class of buildings to be erected on

Whether the proposed Y. M. C. A. dining hall and dormitories will be considered as coming within the pro-hibited classes of buildings may be determined before the plans for the building are completed.

Mayor W. C. Goffatt and Reeve R. J. 
