

LEAFS FINISH ONE RUN

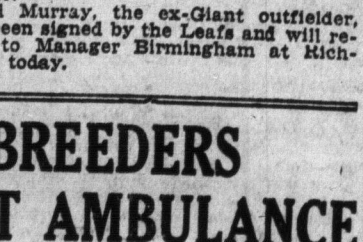
