

STEVENS IS BETTER

TWO ARE HEROES OF Minister of Customs Leaves ONTARIO TRAGEDY

Camp Director Gives Life to Help Fellows; Adjutant Also Gallant

when a canoe in which they were paddling capsized in Balsam Lake, near 6 KILLED IN RIOTS

Ray Sheabutcher, director of the camp at which the boys were staying, and who is among the dead, was one of the boys to play a hero's role. Incapacitated by an injured knee he was among the few who occupied positions on top of the everturned canoe. Mours passed and the ranks of the boys in the water were thinning. Sheabutcher apperently decided that he should give his place on top of the canoe to another. He then offered up a prayer for the safety of those still surviving and bidding them good bye, slipped into the water and disappeared. He could not swim.

To Lambden, the camp adjutant, who was saved is accorded by the other survivors a gallant part in the long and grim fight against death. He repeatedly swam around the canoe instructing the more youthful boys how to hang on and to keep up their courage. As the boys weakened he helped them in every way he could until they became entirely helpless and disappeared. As daylight broke the canoe touched an island and the four survivors scrambled ashore.
