CITY WILL SEND GIFT OF \$1,000

Aid For The Newfoundland Sufferers

TELEPHONE CABLE

Permission Given With Provision For Damages—Street Work and Retaining Walls—Mr. Elliott's Complaint

At a meeting of the common council yesterday afternoon the sum of \$1,000 was voted towards the relief of distressed residents of Newfoundland, bereaved and penniless because of the recent sealing disaster. The sum was granted upon the reading of an official letter from J. H. Bennett, acting premier of the ancient colony.

Commissioner Agar recommended that the order for accepting the Sun Company's tender for 800 gallons of residual oil at 12.08 cents per gallon be cancelled as the city was expected to pay the duty and no sample was submitted. The tender of the Carritte-Paterson Mfg. Co. at 18 1/2 cents a gallon was accepted.

The acting commissioner of harbours, ferries and public lands recommended renewal leases of lots on the West Side to Oscar and Daisy K. Hanson and to Michael Gahney, at a ten per cent. advance, and to Margaret Kelegher at \$20. These were adopted.

The Dunlop Tire & Rubber Company's request to be allowed to run a pipe from the second story of their building down an electric light pole to the street for the purpose of delivering air to their patrons from their automatic plant, was referred to the commissioners of safety and public works jointly.

street extension asking for sidewalks, water and sewerage, was referred to the commissioners of public works jointly. All the members spoke in favor of giving some attention to this section as it was exposed to the public gaze during the ball season.

Communications from the W. M. S. of Centenary church and from the Social Service Council of the Presbyterian church, approved of the closing of the road houses.

A letter from S. H. Elliott, complaining of not being able to secure a satisfactory roadway or in a vacant lot. After the tank came, however, the company wished to place it under its own building in close proximity to other buildings in the block, and he refused to take the responsibility for allowing it to be placed. He had understood he was dealing with the Canadian Oil Company and he had asked Peter Clinch, as a representative of the fire underwriters, if he had approved of the location of the tank, and Mr. Clinch said he had not.

Commissioner Agar said that although the council was the last court of appeal from a decision of a commissioner, no action could be taken until all the facts were known. He suggested that the matter be taken up in committee of the whole, with representatives of the company and of the fire underwriters present, and that the ground be visited. This was agreed to. Commissioner McEllen said that the Imperial Oil Company had made application for a similar privilege, but intended to bury its tank in a private roadway.

Commissioner McEllen called attention to the condition of the public steps in Indianstown, and Commissioner Agar said that it would be as cheap in the end to take the steps off the sidewalk and cast a railing in the solid rock.

It was decided to purchase from the Sun Oil Company a quantity of asphaltic road oil at 8.00 cents a gallon, and another from the Redwood Company at 8.5 cents a gallon. Commissioner Agar said he had purchased a quantity of chloride of lime for use in the street at one third less than what was paid to United States firms last year.

Commissioner Agar also reported that he had obtained for the retaining walls, one in Moore street, which would cost \$1,100, and one in Rockland road, which would cost \$400. The engineers had reported on them, and work would be commenced as soon as the weather allowed.

WANT LISTS REVISED

At a meeting of the Trades and Labor Council last evening it was decided to take up the matter of a revision of the voters' lists at City Hall. It was said that the names of many who were qualified to vote were not on the lists for last Tuesday. It was said that the names not being placed on the list showed a determination to keep the workers from voting. It was decided to make the practice of disenfranchising large numbers of workers for non-payment of taxes was unfair, since they had to pay daily.
