Society Leaders in London Take Up Bullfinches Trained by German Cobblers

(Times Special Correspondence) London, March 25.—When Caruso comes over here next month, he is likely to find himself more or less out of it. His engagement at Covent Garden Opera House for the first time in seven years, holds good, of course, but whether or not many engagements for private concerts will come his way is a question. Human operations are a matter of fact, and in response to a nod of the head of their promoters will warble the "Toreador" song from "Carmen," the "Soldier's Chorus" from "Faust," or an aria from "Agnus Dei," as accurately as Caruso himself could sing.

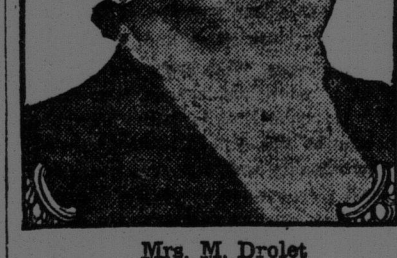

Daily Hints For the Cook

BOSTON FUDGE CAKE. One-half cup butter, 2 cups brown sugar, 2 yolks of eggs, beaten light; 2 ounces chocolate, melted; 1 1/2 cup sour milk, 1/2 cup water; 2 1/2 cups flour, 1 teaspoon soda, 2 whites of eggs, beaten dry. Filling--Two cups brown sugar, 1/4 cup butter, 1/2 cup milk, 1/2 cup nutmats. Frosting--Six tablespoons grated chocolate, 6 tablespoons granulated sugar, 1 tablespoon sweet cream, 1 tablespoon butter. Prepare the cake in the usual manner. The ingredients are given in the order of use. Boil the sugar, butter and milk to a soft ball, for the filling; add the nut meats and beat until thick enough to spread. Melt the chocolate for the frosting, add the sugar, cream and butter; let cook a few minutes, then spread over the cake. CREAM CAKES. Two cups of flour, 1 of butter, 1 1/2 pint of water. Boil water and butter together and while boiling stir in by degrees the flour. When smooth remove from stove and let it get cool, then add 5 eggs and 1/4 teaspoon of soda. Drop mixture on buttered tins one inch apart and bake in quick oven. Cream Filling--One pint of milk; while milk is heating beat together 1/2 cup of flour, 1 or 2 cups of sugar and 2 or 4 eggs. Turn into boiling milk and cook until it thickens. When ready to serve cut into slices of cakes with a sharp knife and fill with the cream filling or whipped cream. Flavor to suit taste with vanilla, orange or lemon. In adding the eggs to the batter and flour beat in 1 egg thoroughly before adding another.

THE BANGOR AND AROOSTOOK (Bangor Commercial) Commencing Monday the Bangor & Aroostook R. R. is to resume complete passenger service over its lines, putting back into operation Train No. 17 north-bound, between Northern Maine Junction, and Van Buren, and Train No. 8, south-bound, between Van Buren and Northern Maine Junction. These two trains were taken off shortly after the beginning of the strike. They have been running for several weeks north of Oakland and on Monday will resume the complete schedule, which will be much to the gratification of the traveling public. The complete freight embargo was lifted Monday of this week and next Monday will find complete normal conditions on the road. The B. & A., according to a statement of the officials, has been in condition to resume this service for some time but owing to the attempted wrecking and the tampering with the telegraph wires had not up to the present time felt justified in running passenger trains at night. This reason alone has prevented an earlier resumption of service. The cost of a mudday day in London is something like five thousand pounds.
