WOMAN WEDS CONVICT

WITH DETECTIVES BY

Man Who Committed Crime for Her Sake

Allowed Out of Prison for Ceremony.

NICE, April 11.—A marriage of a pathetic character took place on Thursday at the city hall at Nice, the bridegroom being a convict, Thermistocles Dented, aged 26, and the bride a young girl for whose sake he committed the crime which caused him to be recently sentenced to eight years' penal servitude in French Guiana.

Dented is the son of a retired general, and worked as an accountant. In November, 1906, he obtained work at Beauvoisin, near Nice, and went to live at an inn kept by a family named Oregno. He became engaged to the landlady's daughter, Emma Marie, and earned the hatred of several relatives of his fiancée. Anonymous complaints were sent to the police about him, but he was always able to clear himself.

Meeting one of his slanderers, Mario Deloni, Dented, after a violent dispute, shot him dead. He was arrested, tried, and sentenced.

Mrs. Oregno wrote to her lover in jail saying that she was more attached to him than ever, and would marry him in spite of his sentence. The necessary permission was obtained, and the marriage took place on Thursday.

The bride was dressed in dark grey and looked extremely sad. When her lover, handcuffed and guarded by two detectives, entered the room she fainted, and was unconscious for twenty minutes.

The convict had been allowed to wear ordinary clothes, and the detectives having unhandcuffed him the ceremony proceeded. Both bride and groom wept silently as they stood holding each other's hands. Everyone present was affected to tears. When the ceremony was over and the bride and bridegroom had exchanged passionate farewells, the registrar delivered an exhortation, praising the bride's "noble act," and wishing the newly married pair much happiness in the future.

The detectives then stepped forward and led the prisoner, his face hidden in his hands, from the room. He goes at once to the penal settlements in French Guiana, where, if his behavior is good, his wife will be allowed to go out to him at the end of four years.
