

that it has not been more any or bring the cases into court. "It has been necessary during the year to convey two boys who were wards to the Industrial School, One of these was a ward of the Ptovincial Government, and in this presence was not responsible.

One of these was a ward of the Provincial Government, and in this manner we were not responsible, for this boy, but he was living in our county and Mr. Kelso ordered his comitment. "During the year it has been necessary to commit one girl to the House of FRefuge. We have done this for the firl's protection as she is decidedly simpleminded, and was not able to take care of herself when at large. This is the only means we have and the ony place we have where we can place such girls, and then they must be over 16 before it can be done. H is reckoned that in the County of Waterloo alone there are about a hundred of such eases who should not be left at large, but who should be segegated, so that they cannot their own species. We have been promised again and sgain by differ-ent governments some relief along this line, but up to the present time nome has been forthcoming. The Children's Aid Society as the law stands at present, is bound to take and eare for all these simple minded of il kept together in a proper institution could be made happy, and at the same time live a useful life, as nearly all these simple people ean be made useful in the proper environment. "We have had about 60 cases

ean be made useful in the proper environment. "We have had about 60 cases in the Juvenile Courts which have been held in different parts of the county. We find that in a rood number of these cases of delinquency the fault lies with the parents, they are either too easy or too se and seem to live a life entirely a rom their children. Another entirely apart tributing cause to delinquency is truancy, and it has been decided by Juvenile Judge Weir to hold Juvenile Courts in any district in the county where truancy exists. We would like to state that in our judgment truancy is not an effected We would like to state that in our judgment trunney is not an offence only found in towns and eities, but is practised to a great extent in the country districts. In fact in the Juxenile court this year, we have had quite a number of eases where booss and grick under school age have been kept away to work. It seems that in some parts of our community boys and grick know all that they need to know at about 12 whan these latter years sho 1 be the best and most important of their school life. Our office work is rather heavy, as copies of every-thing are kept and filed, so as to be handly if wanted in the days that are to come. We have not
