LENINE AND TROTSKY DEMAND EVACUATION OF Bessarabia WITHIN 48 HOURS

LONDON, May 2.—The Russian Soviet Government has sent an ultimatum to Rumania demanding the evacuation of Bessarabia. Wireless dispatches from Moscow say that the Rumanian Government is given 48 hours in which to make reply.

DECLARED ILLEGAL

Second Attempt of U.S. to Stop Child Labor Fails.
Greensboro N.C. May 2.—The child labor section of the war revenue bill placing a prohibitive tax on products of child labor entering interstate commerce was declared unconstitutional to-day by Federal Judge Boyd.

Last year he declared void the original Child Labor Act but the United States Supreme Court reversed his decision by one vote. The revenue law levies 10 per cent tax on interstate products of factories employing children under 14 years of age or those between 14 and 15 years working more than eight hours daily.

WANTED IN GUELPH CASE. BROUGHT FROM MICHIGAN.

GUELPH, May 2.—Another important witness in the Dutli murder case has been secured. Inspector Miller took a trip to Muskegon, Mich. and to-day returned, being accompanied by Rae Burdette, the young woman who was at the Mallot house the night of the murder, and who disappeared quickly the day following the murder.

It is understood that she will give important evidence at the trial which will corroborate the evidence of some of the other witnesses. She came here willingly with the inspector and is prepared to tell all she knows about the case.

She is being detained at the county jail, as a material witness.
