TWO REPRESENTATIVES FROM ACROSS BOARD TO ACCOMPANY SARNIA DELEGATION TO-MORROW.

Sarnia Feb. 8.—A strong delegation will go from here to Stratford on Tuesday to attend the highway meeting with the end in view of a new and improved thoroughfare from Toronto to Sarnia, via the classic city.

A committee has been appointed but not alone will these make the trip to the gathering, because every Sarnian is vitally interested and perhaps at least 50 will make the journey on Tuesday independently.

The committee follows: George P. France, director of the Sarnia Chamber of Commerce and secretary-treasurer of the Automobile Club; Peter Gardiner, ex-warden of Lambton County; Wm. Nesbitt, mayor of Sarnia; W.A. Barrie, president of the Automobile Club; C.W. Haensel, secretary Port Huron Chamber of Commerce and State Highway Commissioner Baird of the Michigan highway board.

C.W. Haensel of Port Huron and State Highway Commissioner Baird will represent the details of the Michigan Liberty terminals at Port Huron. A representative of the Northern Navigation Company will accompany the delegates to present the data

showing the need of a highway for the enormous fruit and vegetable shipments from the Forest, Theford and Arkona districts.

Death of H. E. Buttrey The death occurred at St. Joseph's Hospital London of one of London's best known and most popular travelers and businessmen Harry E. Buttrey. He was stricken with influenza three weeks ago and pneumonia which resulted in his death followed. He was for seven years president of the Travelers' Club which he organized; a past president of the Irish Benevolent Society; a Shriner of Mocha Temple; a member of Kilwinning Lodge of the Scottish Rite and a Knight Templar of the Masonic Order.

Father, Son & Company On Sunday morning Feb. 9 the first guns were fired in proclamation of the international Father and Son week. Men from outside centres, prominent in boys' work, members of the national council,

occupied the pulp of the various city churches morning and evening. On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evening a men's institute will be held in Benton St. Baptist Church, for the purpose of interesting, educating and securing boy leaders. On Friday evening the Texas club of Kitchener will entertain the fathers and sons of the city to a banquet to which all fathers and sons 10 years of age and upward are invited.

Galt Police Promptly Nab Hold-Up Men

Three hours after they held up and robbed Migaidich Mouradian, an Armenian residing at 12 Gleebe Street, Galt, William Hobbs, aged 21, and Oscar Goodfellow, 19, were arrested on Queen's Square by Constable Fred Tahan. At 10.45 Saturday night M. Mouradian reported to the police that after being followed about half a mile from Main Street to where the G.T.R. track crosses Kerr Street he was attacked from behind and that while one man kept a hand over his mouth the other rifled his pockets securing \$15 and his cell papers. Chief of Police Gorman at once spread the net and the capture of the hold-up men was made at 1.10 yesterday morning. Both admitted their guilt and were placed in the cells. They had equally divided the money and hidden the Armenian's papers beneath some machinery on the flatcar at the C.P.R. depot.

What is the Cause of Dissatisfaction?

The inquiry ordered by the Brantford Police Commissioners to ascertain if possible the reason for dissatisfaction on the part of members of the Brantford police force which led to many resignations including those of former constables who had resumed their positions after being overseas, was heard Tuesday, the Commissioners meeting on Monday to make preliminary arrangements. The dissatisfaction felt is against the senior members of the department, and it is also alleged that appointments were made unfairly in consideration of the older service of many of the men.

Brantford Election Not Likely Contested

The municipal election of January last is not likely to be contested. Steps were taken recently to have the election of Mayor MacLennan, Brantford, invalidated on the ground that the City Council in extending the time of voting did so after the statutory time limit had been passed. Such invalidation would have upset the entire election. The preliminary steps were not completed, and in view of the fact that this is the last week for such action, it is not likely that anything will result. The by-laws voted upon will be submitted to the Legislature for validation.

Canadians in N. Russia

ALLIES ADVANCE FIVE MILES.

Archangel Feb. 8.—Allied forces advanced five miles along the Petrograd road from Kadish, yesterday. After Canadian artillery had silenced the enemy's guns. Two Bolshevik guns were captured by the allies during the fighting.

Heavy reinforcements arrived and strengthened the Bolshevik front and the allies retired to new positions three miles south of Kadish.

New heavy guns which were brought into position on the railroad front shelled the Bolshevik forces heavily yesterday afternoon. Allied airplanes bombed enemy positions at Seltino, the Dykna and Spagovari on the Vegera yesterday.

A Russian courier who has arrived here, reports that troops operating through the forests to the left of the Petrograd road south of Kadish succeeded for a time in cutting off the retreat of 800 of the enemy who were at the same time attacked on the front by the allied infantry.

When it became necessary to withdraw from the extremely advanced position the guns which had been captured were destroyed.

Twenty years ago today the Spanish-American war was closed with the signing of the peace treaty by President McKinley.
