- (6.) In the case of Quebec he shall have his Real Property Qualification in the Electoral Division for which he is appointed, or shall be resident in that Division:
- 24. The Governor General shall from Time to Time, in the Queen's Summons of Name, by Instrument under the Great Seal of Canada, summon qualified Senator. Persons to the Senate; and, subject to the Provisions of this Act, every Person so summoned shall become and be a Member of the Senate and a Senator.
- •25. Such Persons shall be first summoned to the Senate as the Queen Summons of ly Warrant under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual thinks fit to First Body of approve, and their Names shall be inserted in the Queen's Proclamation Senators. of Union.
- 26. If at any Time on the Recommendation of the Governor General Addition of the Queen thinks fit to direct that Three or Six Members be added to Senators in the Senate, the Governor General may by Summons to Three or Six certain cases. qualified Persons (as the Case may be), representing equally the Three Divisions of Canada, add to the Senate accordingly.
- 27. In case of such Addition being at any time made the Governor Reduction of General shall not summon any Person to the Senate, except on a further Senate to like Direction by the Queen on the like Recommendation, until each of normal the Three Divisions of Canada is represented by Twenty-four Senators and no more.
- 28. The Number of Senators shall not at any Time exceed Seventy-Maximum number of Senators.
- 29. A Senator shall, subject to the Provisions of this Act, hold his Tenure of Place in the Senate for Life.
- 30. A Senator may by Writing under his Hand addressed to the Regulation of Governor General resign his place in the Senate, and thereupon the same Senate.
- 31. The Place of a Senator shall become vacant in any of the follow- Disqualification of Senators:
 - (1.) If for two consecutive Sessions of the Parliament he fails to give his Attendance in the Senate:
 - (2.) If he takes an Oath or makes a Declaration or Acknowledgment of Allegiance, Obedience, or Adherence to a Foreign Power, or does an Act whereby he becomes a Subject or Citizen, or entitled to the Rights or Privileges of a Subject or Citizen, of a Foreign Power:
 - (3.) If he is adjudged Bankrupt or Insolvent or applies for the Benefit of any Law relating to Insolvent Debtors, or becomes a public Defaulter:
 - (4.) If he is attainted of Treason or convicted of Felony or of any infamous Crime:
