Sir

In reference to your letter of the 3rd Inst. relating to the Block of land patented to M^r. G. S. Tiffany and to the unhealthiness of the neighborhood supposed to be caused by the stagnant water from the overflow of the supply required for the saw mill, I am pleased to say that the Governor General is of opinion that every exertion ought to be made to lessen so great an evil and to remove it altogether if possible, and His Excellency directs that you will communicate with the Patentee with a view to the adoption of some arrangement for the relief of the Settlers in the vicinity of M^r. Newrie's Creek.
