(2) The Officer Commanding the Ottawa Highlanders will detail a Guard of Honour with King's Colour and Band to be in position in front of the Central entrance of the Parliament Buildings, facing North, at 2.45 P.M., and will receive H.R.H. The Prince of Wales on his arrival with a royal salute, and a further royal salute on his departure.

During the ceremony of the dedication of the Altar in the Memorial Chamber, the Peace Tower, Houses of Parliament, the Flag on the Tower will be dipped, to indicate that the ceremony has been performed. The Guard of Honour will present arms.
