will find its noblest expression and fulfilment of its highest destiny only as its life approaches in expression the aims and the ideals of the noblest and highest individual life. If we would serve our country in the truest and surest way, let us, with the Hebrew, believe that God continues to work through the centuries, and has work for continents as well as men. With the Founder of our faith, let us believe that all life is sacred, and that human life, however shattered and sordid at times it may appear, carries within itself the reflected image of the divine. In this belief, and in this way only, will our country realize its highest destiny.
