Sir,-

With reference to your letter of the 25th ultimo (your file 940(301), regarding the fencing of the rights of way of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway through Indian Reserves in the Agency of Mr. W. J. McAllan, I beg to say that this Railway passes through the following Indian reserves in that Agency,-

Ft. George Nos. 2 and 4,

Stony Creek No. 6

Fraser Lake Nos. 4 and 5 (Stollequo), also through three Indian locations surveyed as lots Nos. 5402 and 5403 on Burne Lake (Charles and Tibbette), and through lot 558 and one un-numbered lot adjoining lot 558 on the west. The last two are situated at the North end of Decker Lake.

While I would be pleased to see <sup>the</sup> Railway Company fence all reserve rights of way, the pressing need at the present time is on lots 5402 and 5403, on or near which five Indian horses have been killed within the last 15 months.
