Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 7th instant, I beg to state that a further advance for travelling expenses, and freighting was not sent to Mr. Agent Colcleugh, because he did not requisition, therefore. The Department expects its officials to foresee their requirements in financial as well as in any other matters and they should not delay until the last moment to submit their applications. In future you should see that the officials in your Inspectorate make their requisitions in proper time.

In order not to delay the Departure of the Treaty party, on the 14th instant, the Department is placing by wire the sum of \$1400.00 to the credit of Mr. Colcleugh, in the Dominion Bank, Selkirk.
