Arrive Parliament Buildings, Central Entrance under Tower. Proceed to Room 212 to leave coat 2.45 p.m. and hat.

2.55 p.m. Leave Room 212 for Main Entrance.

His Excellency the Administrator (Sir Lyman Duff) 3.00 p.m. arrives Main Entrance and is met by Prime Minister and Leader of Senate. Outside there will be no Mounted Escort or Guard of Honour. Administrator is attended by Mr. Pereira and Cdr. Sherwood. Honorary A.D.C's and other officials will be

formed up inside Main Entrance

Procession from Main Entrance to Senate Speaker's quarters. Order for processions is shown below.

Frocession from Speaker's Quarters to Senate Chamber

Inside Senate Chamber Administrator sits on Throne (Speaker's Chair having been moved to side) Prime Minister stands on dais, at Administrator's right hand.
