## CLYDESDALES FROM SCOTLAND.

It is some time since we have had an opportunity of reporting an importation of draught horses. It is exceedingly gratifying to know that a move such as we have to report has taken place. Graham Bros., of Claremont, have from time to time, in the past, brought among us several leading Scotch prize-winning stallions and mares, which have been scattered over our country, doing much good wherever introduced. The importation, which has been just a few days landed, comprises six head of first-class animals, well-known in Scottish showyards, while one of them has won 1st prizes at the Royal and the Great Yorkshire as well. The Scottish Farmer has the following to say re this importation: "The Royal winner is the splendid big three-year-old horse, The Royal Standard (1014), lately owned by Mr. Pilkington, and one of the best made Clydesdale stallions, with the best kind of feet and legs, and great size and weight, in the country. As a yearling, he was first at Kilmarnock, Ayr, Dumfries Union, The Royal, and the Great Yorkshire; and second at the Highland and Agricultural Society's Show at Edinburgh. As a two-year-old he was first and champion at Castle Douglas, first at Ayr, third at Glasgow, Edinburgh, and the H. and A. S.'s Show, Aberdeen, and first at the Great Yorkshire Show at Beverley. This year he was only exhibited at Kilmarnock, where he was placed third; and in the opinion of good judges he has few equals of his age in Scotland. He was got by the Balmiedie stud horse, Royalist (6242), champion of the Royal Northern Agricultural Society, and winner of numerous prizes at the Highland and other shows, as well as the best breeding horse in the country. The dam of Royal Standard was the Macgregor prize mare, Betinda, formerly owned by Mr. William Robertson, Linkwood, Elgin; so that this horse is strong in Darnley blood. Other three of the horses of this shipment are the Macquaker (9798), a beautiful three-year-old colt which won first prize at Dalbeattie last year; the MacClelland (9942), which stood second at Kirkcubright (this year); and the MacMorland (9601), a remarkable well-bred colt which won second prize at Kilmarnock as a yearling. He is own brother to the well-known Drummuir prize mare, Helen Macgregor, the Chicago winner, Ross Macgregor, and other prize winners. These three colts are by Macgregor, and another by the same sire is found in the yearling, Sen sation, bred by Mr. Parlane, Craigdhu, and winner of first prizes this year at Kilmarnock and Kirkcubright. The sixth horse is the well-known big dark-colored Meridian (9235), winner of third at Edinburgh and first at Kirkcubright when a yearling, second at the Royal when a two-year-old, and the Lockerby premium horse when a three-year-old. He was got by the successful breeding horse, Knight o' Lothian (4489), whose breeding was almost identical with that of Macgregor, and his dam is well known as a regular breeder of good foals. This, as these notes show, is a superior shipment of first-class horses. Along with them goes the well-bred Hackney stallion, Royal Standard (3918), bred by Mr. H. B. Lane, Limavady. He was got by the Limavady Ayr champion horse, Excelsior (198), the sire of the beautiful pair of mares shown very successfully this season, and one of which was sold at a high price a few months ago."
