Diogesin Appstonate information in the second secon had the secondary effect of increasing the mission work of the religious orders. There is not any religious order that has not more missionaries at work to day than it had a decade of years ago. The demand for the services of the religious in giving missions has multiplied a hundred fold. The reason for this wonderful increase is the exploitation of the idea of missions by the Apostolic Mission House Movement. It has increased the demand for missions. It is for this reason that representatives of the religious orders have been glad to join in the missionary congresses that have been held at the Mission House.

Among the other reports which were made at the Directors' meeting was the fact that Dr. Herbert Vaughan who spent the last year at the Mission House, has established a similar institution at Brondesbury Park, in the diocese of Westminster under the approbation of the English hierarchy for the training of missionaries to non-Catholics in England.

There are two priests on their way from Australia to the mission house to learn the special methods and policy that are affirmed there in order that they may return to emphasize the same methods in the Antipodes. Most Rev. P. J. Ryan and the Rev.

A. P. Doyle were elected to succeed themselves as directors for the ensuing six years.


