

A LIBRARY FOR CLERGYMEN.

In his annual report to the Synod. Principal C. C. Waller, of Huron College, London, made the following recommendation:-

"It is further suggested that the College should be asked to provide a guest room, and to arrange that any clergyman of the diocese might come into residence for a week in order to make use of the library. In this way it is estimated that every six years every clergyman so desiring might have the intellectual refreshment of a week in the College, during which he could make use of the library and even attend some lectures. The ac-tual cost to the College would not be excessive, probably \$150 would cover the actual expenditure for room, light and meals. Your Committee respectfully recommend the granting of a sum of \$150 by the Synod for the purpose of providing the extra money needed to give effect to these recommendations.


