BERLIN WRITER GIVES HIS VIEWS.

Impressed With Russ Drive, **But Thinks Germans** Are Holding Them.

Berlin, July 7, via. London, July -The military correspondent of The Zeitung Am Mittag, commenting on the war situation, writes:
"The fighting on all fronts is increasing in extent and violence. The enemy everywhere is attempting to throw fresh troops into the struggle which seems to be approaching earer and nearer its maximum intensity. The mightiest exertions are being made on all sides to force a lecision, and the tension can scarce become higher."

After summarizing the official re-ports from the various theatres of war, the correspondent continues: No Entente Success Yet.

"It still is too early for a final verdict upon the situation, as the struggles upon the principal fronts still are in progress. The Germans, however, hitherto have been able to hold up the enemy's advance on the west as well as on the south and east. Neither British, French, Russians, nor Italians have attained large or decisive successes while, in places where the Central powers have assumed the offensive, as in Volhynia and south of the Dniester their operations have been conducted with success

Will Be Heavy Fighting "This situation enables us to look orward with a certain amount of assurance and with calm confidence to further developments of the situ ttion. . We do not dare to overlook the fact that our opponents are making mighty efforts, and are throwing n all available forces to attain suc ess. Our troops on all the fronts are aced by numerically superior forces and therefore are. confronted. with the prospect of further heavy fight-

WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Maultoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Dutles—Six months residence upon and ultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres, on certain conditions.
