Montreal, Feb. 28.—A young and well-known physician who hails from the Northwest and who saw the Count de Castellare with the doud party in Winnipeg, claims he is the same De Castellare who lived in Winnipeg five years ago and was then the talk of the town.

For this purpose inspectors appointed by the Government will endeavor within the next ten days to visit every farm situated within the flooded districts in order to ascertain the quantities of seeds required, and these will be furnished with printed requisition forms of application.

If, upon receiving the report of the inspectors and the requisitions of the section, the Government will decide to supply seed, then the same will be provided at the lowest cash market price, to be secured on a promissory note, payable in January, 1937, and bearing interest at 5 per cent. per annum.

Should there be any settlers within the flooded districts whose farm the inspectors failed to reach within the ten days they will then be notified to the Provincial Secretary, having formation sent to them.

Applicants must confine themselves to their actual needs, as extravagant requests will not be entertained.
