ADULTERATION OF FOOD STUFFS IS VERY COMMON.

The majority of the people have litthe exact knowledge of the exact nature of the ordinary supplies which they purchase over the counters of provision stores, and which constitute their staple foods. The surprising extent to which our commonest foods and drinks are adulterated and counterfeited, and the crying necessity for legislation which will control and check the evil, have been well proved by the results of the senatorial investigation which was made in Chicago last spring. Before the senatorial committee, appointed just prior to the adjournment of congress, and headed by Senator Mason, several prominent experts gave testimony. Dr. Wiley who has been chief chemist of the agricultural department at Washington, for many years, asserted that nearly every kind of food upon the market is, to a greater or lesser extent, adulterated, misbranded, or otherwise rendered harmful or fraudulent. More Vermont maple sugar is made every year, in Davenport, Iowa, from cheap yellow sugar, flavored with vegetable extracts, than can be produced from all the maple trees in the whole state of Vermont! Current jelly is manufactured; glucose, sugar, a vegetable acid, and some coloring and flavoring matter complete the delicacy! Nearly all of the "pure olive oil" imported to this country is cotton-seed oil made in the Southern States, sent abroad, and there refined and returned to us as the product of the Mediterranean
