Commencing Monday the train will arrive in Cardston at 6:35 p. m. in place of 7:50 p. m. heretofore. The morning schedule will remain the same, the train leaving at 8 o'clock.

Mr. J. P. Jordan, Sr., formerly of Mt. View, is looking over our country with Mr. Dion of Spokane with a view to a trade or location by the last named who is favorably impressed with our country and its possibilities.

Mrs. J. A. Hammer has been seriously ill for several weeks past and as she evidenced no improvement for a considerable time, Dr. P. M. Campbell was called and came up on Sunday. The trouble seems to be with the heart and nerves and she is advised to be very quiet and careful for a long time to come but that she has every reason to be hopeful for the future.

The last two cars of trees arrived on Saturday's freight and went out rapidly on Monday and Tuesday. One was of Cottonwood and the other of Ash. These were distributed through Mr. Jao, F. Parrish and Mr. Wm. Henderson, from the cars near the mill. Cardston will have out something like seven thousand trees this year including the Temple Park and those privately planted.

There was a very expensive breakage of the large plate glass window in the premises occupied by the Cardston Pharmacy sometime on Sunday last. A stone or other missile was thrown by some party unknown, breaking the plate glass 54 x 96 inches. A hole almost like that of a bullet was made near the lower margin. This is an expensive glass and will mean close to one hundred and fifty dollars to replace it. The miscreant should be made to pay roundly for this serious damage.

Miss W. A. Suttaby, Instructor in Home Economics at the Provincial School of Agriculture, Raymond, will be in Cardston on Saturday, May 28th, and will meet with the Women's Institute and the Farm Women organization in the afternoon. She will give a demonstration lecture on "Textile-buying". This will include home tests for the purpose of detecting wool, cotton, silk and linen. Instruction as to the comparative strength of various weaves and proper use of materials will also be given. Everyone is cordially invited to attend.

Frank, from Frankburg, was the only one from that Ward. He and Mr. W. J. Whitehead are the High Councillors resident in the Northern Wards. We were glad to see Bishop David E. Quist of Claresholm also, who attended with Mr. Rice of that Ward. There were none of the Calgary or Gleichen branches present, and Orton Ward had no gentlemen representatives, although Mrs. Tolley was present. On the whole there was a very good representation considering the busy time.

## Funeral of Everett Pitcher

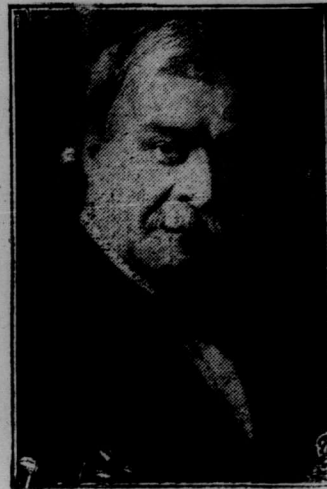
