### EAP.THQUAKES.

The most notable and d astrous earthquake on record, may be said, are those of Ita (526) when 120,000 perso perished, and of Sicily (169 when 60,000 lost their live According to Gibbon, towa 542 each year was marked wi the repetition of earthquakes such duration that Constan nople was shaken above for days-of such extent that the shock was communicated to the whole surface of the empire. Antioch a quarter of a million persons are said to have peris ed. This period of earthqual and plague (542.7) was period when the superi planets were in perihelion, they are now. Arabian Persian chronicles record earthquakes between seventh and eighteenth cent ries, some lasting from forty seventy days, and nearly all a companied by winds or floo or terrible storms of lightning and thunder. Readers of t "Relations des Jesuites" w remember the great earthquak of 1663, which shook and tosse the earth for six months fro Gaspe to Montreal, the rival the earthquake of 1811 the Mississippi valley. Th severest of the earthquakes fe in this region was that of Nov ember, 1755, an echo of the cor vulsion that tumbled dow Lisbon—and saved the Pompa ministry, through the fact the the minister's house was almost the only one left uninjured an his family one of the few no bereaved of a member. Heir in his interesting work on earth quakes, estimates that on a average two earthquakes a da occur on the earth. In 1870 though there were no sever single shock, 2,225 houses wer destroyed or greatly damage in Italy, ninety-eight person killed and 223 wounded. Th same shock may last for years instance that of Viege, in the Valias, which end wed from Jul 1824, to 1857. At Cabul thirty three severe shocks have bee felt in one day; at Honduras, i 1656, 108 were counted in week, and at Hawaii, in 186 2,000 shocks occured in on month. Hein, it may be said i conclusion, opposes the theor of a connection between earth quakes and v canic eruption and considers that of their coin cidence with atmospheric pher omena as better supported b facts; for they are occasionall preceded or accompanied b thick and widespread fogs a seasons when fogs are not fre quent, by sudden falls of th barometer and equally sudden changes of temperature. Their occurence, however, in the majority of cases coincides with normal meteorological condi tions. Earthquakes are more frequent after sunset than in daytime, in autumn and winter than in spring. The influence of the moon is insignificant.
