Our Enlarged Issue.

Our readers will observe that the Herald appears this week in an enlarged form. To effect this alteration within the compass of our press, we have been obliged slightly to contract the width of the columns, which have, however, been increased from twenty-eight to thirty-two, as well as lengthened each by two inches. By this new arrangement, involving, as it did, a great deal of labor and considerable expense, we are enabled to furnish our patrons with four additional columns of reading matter. This is as much as, under present circumstances, we can do, so we hope, from time to time, to improve the Herald as to make it still more acceptable than we believe it to be at present.

(Since the publication of the Herald was resumed in November, 1882, we have had many proofs of its popularity, not only at home, but with Islanders abroad, among whom it circulates largely. Its subscription list has increased at an extraordinary rate, and within the last three weeks, without any special effort on our part, but by their own free will, one hundred persons have added their names. This is indeed encouraging, and serves to stimulate us in our endeavors to fulfil the promises with which we appeared before the public some twenty months ago.

Our course shall be pursued strictly in the interests of Prince Edward Island, without an unswerving allegiance or a slavish submission to any political party, but we trust that it will be good sense of the people, and thus the sooner place us in a position still further to enlarge our borders and increase our general usefulness.

Conservative Strength in Nova Scotia

WHAT an uproar there was last year in Grit circles regarding the dual position occupied by Sir Charles Tupper, as Minister of Railways and High Commissioner to London. How the Leaders of the party denounced the arrangement as a violation of the law, and how their press, through the whole Dominion, represented that the electors of Cumberland County were anxiously awaiting the opportunity of wreaking their vengeance upon the Government for making them the victims of such a vile outrage. When brought before Parliament what precious time was wasted before the matter was disposed of. It appeared as if the whole future prosperity of the country was bound up and depended upon the settlement of this issue. We were told of a revolution of feeling in Nova Scotia against the Dominion Government, and against everything Conservative that could speak in trumpet tones should Sir Charles Tupper dare to give the people the opportunity of expressing their will, and resigned his seat, and what was issued for a new election, and what was the result? The Conservatives met, entertained Sir Charles as a public banquet, and nominated his successor. The Grits also met and nominated the strongest man in their ranks—Mr. Phipps—the Leader of the Nova Scotia Government, and who had been returned at the head of the poll for the representation of Cumberland County in the Local Legislature. Mr. Phipps accepted the nomination, there was a great flourish of trumpets in the Grit camp, and the speedy downfall of extravagance and corruption was predicted from every outpost. The Morning Chronicle, the principle organ of the party in Nova Scotia, announced "the fact that the Tories are so dumfounded with the turn of events in Cumberland County, so perfectly ill at ease with the blue prospects of their party in that constituency, that incoherent and absurd guessing and predicting, scenes and idle chattering are about all they can do. Divided themselves, lacking in unity and hope, they try to persuade themselves that their opponents are suffering similar tribulations." This was a serious indictment of the Conservatives; but let us see how far have the charges been sustained. We have said that Mr. Phipps accepted the nomination, no doubt for sufficient reasons, and bearing in mind that "Discretion is the better part of valor," we withdrew from the candidature. Effort after effort was made to induce a man to oppose Mr. Tupper, but without avail, and at last the Grits were compelled to approach the Conservatives with offers of coalition. The consequence was that Hon. Charles J. Tupper, the nominee of the Conservative party, was elected on Thursday last by a

slight lead, and having been also a member of the late Government. He is closely connected with this Province, although not a native, his father was born on the island, and he has numerous relations living here. In Cape Breton there will be also a contest to-morrow to fill the vacancy caused by the elevation of the late member, Mr. McDonald, to the Senate. Mr. Hector McDougall is the Government candidate, and is opposed by Mr. Norton I. McKay, who represented the constituency during Mr. McDonald's administration. It is conceded that the representation belongs to a Catholic, to which faith Mr. McDougall belongs, and the opposition of Mr. McKay, a Protestant, is not viewed with satisfaction. From what we can learn, there is little doubt that Mr. McDougall will be victorious.

The Recent Canadian Loan.

During the last Session of the Dominion Parliament, the Minister of Finance was authorized to borrow a sum of fifty millions of dollars, with which to redeem a large amount of bonds soon falling due, as well as to advance the loan to the Pacific Railway. Sir Leonard Tilley accordingly proceeded to England, and issued tenders for a loan of five millions of pounds sterling, bearing interest at three and one-half per cent, the minimum price therefore being fixed at 91. The rate of interest was a new feature in Canadian loans, none having ever been secured before for less than four per cent, while they have ranged as high as five and six per cent. The present venture was therefore attended with considerable risk, but the result has been highly satisfactory. Sir Leonard having succeeded in placing the whole amount at 91 2/3, or an equivalent of better than 104 for outstanding four per cent. The Minister of Finance and the Government are to be congratulated, and the people of Canada may well congratulate themselves at the success which has crowned this latest mission. It proves that notwithstanding the wiles of unparitocratic Grits, and in spite of the efforts of hostile parties in England, Canadian credit is rising higher and higher every year. Ten years ago the Canadian Cartwright placed the first Canadian four per cent loan, the nominal price being 92, but the actual amount realized being only about 87 1/2. Four or five years afterwards Sir Leonard Tilley negotiated a loan bearing a similar rate, for which he obtained 93 1/2 per cent, and quite lately Canadian four per cent bonds in the London market for 106. How does this read in the face of Sir Richard Cartwright's recent utterance that Canada, at the present time, is in a worse position than were the United States at the close of the Civil War? Nor were the markets at all favorable when Sir Leonard Tilley negotiated this last loan. The statements of the Opposition press and of Sir Richard Cartwright, who passes as an authority with a large class of persons who do not know him better, had their damaging effect, and the powerful influence of the Grand Trunk Railway Company was exerted against the Finance Minister. Leading English newspapers, at no time friendly disposed towards the Dominion, spoke of the "jobbery" connected with the Canada Pacific, and, to a very large extent, prejudiced the minds of English investors. The Monetary Times, a Canadian publication, and thoroughly impartial, says:—

Benevolent Irish Society Picnic.

This Annual Picnic of the Benevolent Irish Society was held yesterday (Dominion Day) at Bedford Station. The weather was all that could be desired, and the affair such a success that persons from Charlottetown and from the surrounding country, it being estimated that fully one thousand persons were present. At nine o'clock in the morning, headed by Mrs. O'Connell, the Ladies' Aid Society, they proceeded to Queen Street, and thence by Water Street to the Railway Station, whence they left for the grounds by special train. So soon as arrived the company set to work to enjoy themselves, which all did thoroughly at various kinds of amusements, until six o'clock in the evening, when they came back to Charlottetown. Having returned to St. Charles Hall, the President, Mr. Kelly, thanked the members for the manner in which they had contributed to make the affair a success, and then spoke briefly, alluding to the pleasure it had given him to attend the Picnic, as well as to the last occasion upon which he had the privilege of wearing the regalia of the Society, which was presented to him at the time of the Throated Plover. He referred also to the fact that, lately, at his home in Tignish, a branch of the Society had been founded, nor could he see any reason why other country districts did not take the opportunity of affiliating themselves with an Institution whose intentions are so patriotic, benevolent and praiseworthy. He alluded to the past history of the Society, to its establishment in 1827—thirty-nine years ago—after that of the original members present at its institution, but to two survive, viz. Messrs. Edward Kicham of Souris, and Michael Kelly of Charlottetown.

We regret to state that there were others present on the grounds for purposes of enjoyment. This is the case, we are sorry to say, with nearly all public social gatherings. No sooner is a Picnic or a Tea Party advertised, than certain individuals commence courting their plans for a "bad day," calling to their assistance sordidly liquidated, and the company will not be disappointed, but which are supposed of containing a large percentage of something strong.
