A Conveners' meeting was held at headquarters vesterday morning, and after the usual reports had been received and other business disposed of, the Chairman, Lady Horwood, annced what had been proposed as activities of the Association for the immediate future. There had been a certain amount of delay, which was unavoidable, in ascertaining just what work was most urgent at present, and most suitable for us to undertake, and for this purpose the Executive Committee has been waiting for replies to the telegrams sent to London some weeks ago, asking for information and advice. It has now been decided that the W.P.A. will devote its energies during the winter months to relief work,—to making and providing clothing for the destitute populations of the invaded countries, as our sister associations in Canada and the U.S. are new deing. The need for such assistance is acute. We are told that the suffering in the devastated districts of war-stricken Europe is beyond description. That in Belgium, France and Serbia are millions of destitute women and children, who in addition to enduring the horrors and bereavements of war, are now in dire need of food and clothing. We hear also that in the Bible Lands of Western Asia there are half a million starving, halfnaked people including 400,000 orphaned children. To do what lies in our power to relieve them is the work to which we are now asked to direct ur energies. It is Red Cross work in its truest sense, and Red Cross funds and materials may legitimately be used for this very worthy purpose, as these people are suffering directly from the effects of the war. We are told that the need for clothing is especially urgent—that there is no possibility of having too many garments -and we are asked to make as many simple, sensible garments as we can, -plain dresses and underwear, for women and children, marked with the age, or size for which it is suitable, and with our own W.P.A. label sewn on it, so that the recipients may know that the women of Newfoundland are thinking of them and trying to help them. Shirts are wanted for men, and also socks, so there will be plenty of work for those who prefer to go on knitting and making shirts. The working parties, for the most part, will continue their weekly gatherings, and the Workrooms at Headquarters will be open four days a week as usual, and we hope and confidently expect that our workers will come in as large numbers as when we had our lads at the front to provide for. This is the work that is being done all over this continent at the present time, and the women of Newfoundland must not be behind hand in showing their practical sympathy with these innocent victims of the ravages of war.

A most enthusiastic meeting of men was held in the Battery school house last evening. The Rev. Dr. Bond presided, and addressed the gathering on the school question and its needs, and also congratulated the people on having such an efficient school. The Rev. Dr. Curtis, Supt. of Education, was also present, and spoke of the work done in the school, and answered several questions put to him, satisfactorily to all. A friendly discussion then ensued, and a committee of five nominated to be responsible for the school and its upkeep. Several necessary epairs were ordered to be done and the proverbial hat was passed around and every one chipped in and quite a handsome sum was realized. A deputation from the Whirlwind Campaign Committee of Cochrane Street Methodist Church, consisting of Messrs. A. H. Salter, Arthur Mews, A. Peters and H. N. 
