

## Dried Fish.

Although the dried fish market is lacking in new and outstanding features, there are indications of improvement both at producing centers and distribution points. According to reports during the week, there has been a revival of business with the fall and winter business, and large purchases are being made in Nova Scotia and elsewhere in anticipation of a good demand later in the season. So far as can be learned prices are held firmly at the prevailing quotations, and in no case has there been any pronounced cutting of prices by any factors in the trade here. Reports from the eastward indicate that there is a fair supply available. The catch has not been heavy, however, and strikes and other difficulties have interfered somewhat with curing operations, but it may be estimated that there will be a fair average supply when the season is over. Europe is demanding dried fish from the Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland, and as there were heavy stocks at the latter place, a matter which might have been serious, has been happily adjusted. It is the consensus in New York that there will be a good business this fall and winter.—N. Y. Fishing Gazette.

He was always a "driver"; production and still more production were his aims, and his conduct toward his employees, at any rate in the earlier stages of his career, was exactly the opposite of the theories he advanced in speeches and books. The management of the strike at the Homestead works in 1892 was a blot upon his memory.—Toronto Globe.
