

## Seismic Disturbances.

NO CONNECTION BETWEEN THEM.

New York. (Canadian Press Ltd.) -Theories that some scientific relationship might exist between concurrent volcanic activity reported during the month from Mexico, Argentina, Chile, Italy and Japan are discredited by geological authorities. Dr. Edmund O. Hovey, geologist of the American Museum of Natural History, and a recognized authority on volcanoes and earthquakes, said the areas of disturbances were too widely separated to have any connec-"The eruptions reported," he said, "are from volcanoes so far apart that any relationship is only a presumption. It is beyond belief that the same cause could exist in each case." J. Edmund Woodman, Professor of Geology in New York University, took the view that volcanic eruptions, occurring almost simultaneously in different parts of the world are merely coincidences. "I believe, however, that concurrent oruptions in Alaska and in the Andes mountains of South America have a certain relationship," he added. "There is mountain building going on in many parts of the world, and there are times when we have a series of disturbances extending for instance from the tip of Canada to Cape Horn. Doubtless the same mighty forces have a hand in each of such eruptions, and this might account for simultaneous outbreaks in Chile and Mexico, but would have no bearing on similar disturbances in Europe or

## PROBABLE RELATIONSHIP.

The theory of Professor Woodman regarding a probable relationship beveen disturbances in the same general range of mountains, as for instance the great divide extending down the western edge of North and South America, is strengthened by reports received from Buenos Aires, describing eruptions in the Andes and following within a few hours other reports of disturbances from Mexico.
