Zimmerman was entered both for the mile and the five miles, but did not compete. In an interview he said that he had been shabbily treated. The National Bicyclists' Union refused to admit him as an amateur unless he changed his machine, but assigned no reason for the change, and besides did not give him sufficient time.

GAUDAU'S NEXT OPPONENT.

On their performance at Austin last week Gaudau has very much the better of the situation.

YACHTING—SERIOUS MISHAP.

LONDON, June 13.—The second of the series of yacht races off Dover took place today, but the sport was practically spoiled by an unfortunate mishap which resulted in the withdrawal of the Britannia and Vendetta from the contest.

The yachts were drawn up in position for starting, when the Vendetta yawed across the bows of the Britannia, which was close alongside the Valkyrie and slightly ahead of her, and ran into the Vendetta as the latter's bows came out in front of the Valkyrie, and at once excitement prevailed among the fleet and people on shore. The shock of the collision was so violent that many of the hands were thrown over. The damage was quite serious. The Columbia was first, covering the course in 3 hours, 23 minutes and 37 seconds. The Valkyrie's time was 3 hours, 29 minutes and 32 seconds.
