CHANCELLOR WAS WARMLY WELCOMED

Knights of Pythias Held Big Banquet Last Night in Their Hall.

SOME SPLENDID SPEECHES

Large Number of Guests Listened to Some Excellent Addresses—Names of Those Present.

There was a splendid gathering of Knights of Pythias in the lodge rooms in the Duffield Block last night to welcome Grand Chancellor Geddes, of St. Thomas, on the occasion of his official visit to Prospect Lodge, No. 10.

After the regular business of the evening had been brought to a satisfactory conclusion an adjournment was made to the dining hall where there was a splendid banquet prepared. Bro. George Burdick presided, and after the toast to the King had been honored a number of others were given.

The Toast List.

The toast to the "Supreme Lodge" was responded to by Bro. Horton, of St. Thomas, and Bro. Fitzgerald. Bro. Horton stated that he was delighted to be called upon to respond to the toast, and none were better than the organization, he said, is doing the work that the Knights of Pythias are doing. He thought the supreme lodge should reduce the age limit to 18 years instead of 21, as it now is. This is the age of the young man and one of the greatest mistakes the order is making is in not taking young men at 18. The order would make men better citizens and more useful to their fellows.

Bro. Fitzgerald, speaking of the supreme council, said they were a fine body of men, and one that any order might be proud of. St. Thomas, he said, has produced many splendid officers, and none were better than the present grand chancellor, Bro. Geddes. He urged the young men to take hold of the work and push it vigorously. He also favored admitting young men to the order at 18 years of age.

Man of Eighteen, he said, "is as much developed now as young men of 24 were 30 years ago, owing to the splendid opportunities they have now."

The most important toast of the evening, that to "The Grand Lodge of Ontario," was responded to by Grand Chancellor Geddes, of St. Thomas.

"I wish I could tell you how much I owe in every way to the Knights of Pythias," he said. "There are two things in life we should not worry about the things that we can't help and the things we can help. If you meet difficulties face them bravely and you will be surprised how easily you can overcome them. I would like to see all the lodges of Ontario increase their membership ten per cent. I am satisfied it will be done, too, probably much more. Friendship, charity and benevolence are the cardinal points in the order, and if
