GREAT FLEET IDLE

Over One Hundred Cargo Steamers Laid Up in the Tyne by British Shipowners

"Shipowners are now laying up their vessels more freely than of late," says London Fairplay. "Over 100 steamers are, it is reported, laid up in the Tyne, and on the Clyde has just laid up four of his steamers; a well known London firm are laying up the whole of their fleet of liners and cargo ships, even with their new steamers. Foreign owners are also feeling the depression for I hear and see that many firms who are laying up their vessels. The vessels owned by one Norwegian firm have been laid up for some time, and are now being offered for sale. It is almost impossible to realize anything like a reasonable figure, as buyers are only on the lookout for bargains, and the market is very depressed. The subject of inspection, a material reduction on the price is asked when the ship has been inspected, and occasionally thrown up. The oldest ship brokers in the trade say that they do not remember more difficult times in shipping than the present."
