speed with which the wood is handled is an eye-opener. The large wood which is being cut down is on the sallindalloch estate on the opposite side of the Spey, and a light railway about two miles long has been constructed for the rapid transit of the cut trees. Small bogies on the line convey the logs to the cable head. This cable, which is two inches in diameter and about 700 yards long with its carriage, conveys the logs by gravitation across the river to the sawmill. The empty carriage is pulled back by an engine on the south side of the river. The carriage can accomplish river. The carriage can accomplish six journeys within an hour, and over 400 logs are conveyed across daily to be sawn up.
