The special taxpapers are issued by the District Collectors of Revenue, who are charged with the collection of the fees and the enforcement of the law. The undersigned are satisfied that beneficial results would follow the adoption of a similar system in the Dominion. A complete record could be kept of those licensed in every pagt of the country. The relation, if say, of the number of licensed places to the number and character of crimes and offences committed in each district could be readily traced.
