

MASHED POTATOES.—Boil, or steam, in the usual way, the necessary quantity of potatoes to serve for two dinners. When soft toes to serve for two dinners. When soft and mealy, remove them from the pan, turn one half into a bowl with a pinch of salt, and put them away for next day; the other half must be rubbed through a hot wire sieve. Put a quarter of a pint of milk into a saucepan, and add about an ounce of butter. Set the pan on the fire, and as soon as the milk comes aboil, stir in the sifted potatoes; beat all together briskly over the tire for a minute or two, add salt and pepper to taste, and turn into a very hot dish. They are better when served at once.
