

demand, where necessary, from the High Commands of parties to the Agreement, action under Article 22 to persons under their respective commands who are any of the provisions of the Agreement and insist the High Commands of the parties afford us all assistance and co-operation in the performance of the tasks assigned to us under the Agreement (Article 22).

4. In the ultimate analysis, the successful implementation of the Agreement depends on the co-operation and assistance of the two High Commands and that maintaining and promoting this co-operation makes for more effective implementation of the Agreement on the Cessation of Hostilities in
